2017 brought several changes with the Hogansville Police Department. In September, the agency was honored with its second Medal of Merit in three (3) years from the Troup / LaGrange Valor Awards for Community Outreach.

## Community Programs

2017 HPD Community Programs experienced larger participation and community support than ever before.

From children of all ages scrambling for over 2,200 Easter eggs, Peanuts at Trunk or Treat and the Christmas Parade—it was a great year with the community.

In October and November, HPD and Callaway High School and Hogansville Elementary partnered together for the Community Meals Program to provide Thanksgiving meals for less fortunate members of the community. Overwhelming effort from the students brought into over 3,000 canned items. HPD was able to provide over 90 families with a complete Thanksgiving meal and over 1,500 canned items were delivered to God's Bread Basket.

## Use of Force

In 2017 there were twenty (21) Use of Force incidents documented with nine (9) incidents of force being deployed.

Hands	4
Taser	4
Firearm	1 (animal)

Of the 269 arrests made in 2017, the use of force was required in less than 3% of the incidents.

## Citizen Complaints/Internal Affairs

In 2017 the agency had eight (8) Citizen Complaints filed in comparison to 7 in 2016.

Four (4) complaints were Not Sustained and four (4) were Sustained.

In 2017 the agency conducted three (3) Internal Affairs investigations.

Two (2) investigations were Sustained and one (1) was Not Sustained.
